Anne Arundel County 311

Anne Arundel County has launched a new 311 reporting system through an app. The system allows Anne Arundel County citizens to report **non-emergency** incidents and problems digitally through mobile devices. You can download the app through the App Store or Google Play. A simple signup process is required. The app enables Anne Arundel County citizens to report the following service requests:

- -Lost and found pets
- -Recycling cart requests
- -Broken recycling carts
- -Missing curbside collection
- -Bulk pickup scheduling
- -Potholes
- -Drainage complaints
- -County Recreation and Park concerns
- -Unregistered vehicles
- -Building violations



If you don't have a smart phone, you can call 3-1-1 to get help.



The beaches and park lands are closed from 11pm to 6am and is strictly enforced. We have experienced late night activity in the more secluded areas. This results in disturbances to nearby residents, broken glass, trash, and other paraphernalia being left behind.

Crabbing, fishing, swimming, and mooring of boats is restricted to designated areas.

On all Maryland state waters, a personal watercraft may **not** be operated at **greater than 6 knots (6.9 mph)** within 100 feet of any shore, wharf, pier, bridge structure, abutment, or persons in the water. No one under the age of 16 may operate jet skis in Maryland waters...It's the Law!

Applications are being accepted for the Gray-Mott scholarship program. They must be received by **April 15th** to qualify. The application can be found on our website **Itpoa.info.** Look for the Gray Mott scholarship link in the Information box.

To meet the eligibility requirements, the applicant must:

- 1. Be a son/daughter of a property owner or bonafide tenant of London Towne;
- 2. Have demonstrated participation in community project(s);
- 3. Have satisfactory high school academic achievement with a minimum 2.0 GPA;
- 4. Provide character recommendations and work related references


The Gray/Mott Youth Scholarship was established in 1989 by the LTPOA. This educational scholarship is offered annually to assist current graduating high school seniors with continuing their education at an accredited post-secondary institution of their choice. The scholarship was named after two very special men in our community, who dedicated their time to volunteer service in London Towne, Mr. Charles Gray and the Mr. Ralph Mott.

Gray-Mott (cont)

Each year LTPOA has recognized two students who have demonstrated excellence in community service work. The original awards were \$250.00 each and have been increased based on fundraising efforts. The awards are non-renewable grants for the graduating high school senior who will continue his/her education at either a four-year college or university, or a two-year junior or community college, or an accredited trade, technical or business school.

In 2014, the program's 25th year, the Committee decided to split from LTPOA and apply for tax exempt status. This was to accomplish two things: to increase the fund raising possibilities and to release LTPOA from all responsibilities including the dilemma of covering a shortage in funds. We need your help!!

Over the past few months, several pieces of our playground equipment have been vandalized. In Section 2, at Westminister Park, the young child sliding board was ruined. Someone jumped on it until all of the parts were bent and it became unusable and a safety hazard. It was closed for weeks and had to be repaired at considerable expense to the whole community. In Section 3's playground, the spring ride was destroyed. Someone much too big for the ride got on it & rocked it as hard as they could until the spring snapped. Once again, the equipment was beyond repair and the cost of the replacement was considerable.

Just recently, the 'open space' at Bentley & Shore (across from Mr. Mike's Park) suffered **EXTENSIVE** damage. A large vehicle drove over the 'open space' and chewed up the grass area where many people play ball. This continuing vandalism costs a large amount of money to fill in the damage & then reseed the area.

If anyone has information about who is responsible, please contact LTPOA. This information will be kept confidential and we will have our police force take steps against the person[s] responsible. For many years, the Park & Planning Committee has worked very hard to build our first class playgrounds. Please help us. If you see anyone vandalizing our equipment or park land, please call the police so LTPOA can follow up and perhaps get restitution from those who are damaging our property. The committee would rather spend money on new equipment than spend it on repairs.

On a happier note, spring is here. It was almost 60 today with snow to follow, but spring is almost here. Please enjoy our playgrounds and park lands. We have tried our best to have benches and picnic tables available for community use. Before long, the water will be warm enough & the beaches will open again. The committee hopes all of us will use out facilities & enjoy our land of pleasant living. Yes, it does make the commute worth it.

Are you tired of the southbound traffic backups on Mayo Road??



In response, the Anne Arundel County Constituent Services submitted a request with the Maryland State Highway Administration. This request was to lengthen the left turn light pattern for cars turning left from Mayo Road onto Central Avenue. Since a majority of the vehicles at that light are turning left and not going straight into the high school, it seems that lengthening the time for left turns would help solve the backups on Mayo Road.



LTPOA IDENTIFICATION STICKERS

Rules and regulations are in place to control the unauthorized use of LTPOA property which includes the boat launching ramps, boat docking facilities, fishing and crabbing piers, beaches, parks, Community Hall, parking areas, and all LTPOA parklands and other property.

For access to, and parking on, LTPOA property, owners and bona fide tenants of London Towne are required to <u>permanently</u> display a current LTPOA sticker on all vehicles, vessels and trailers.

Stickers are available for purchase from the Ramps & Credentials Committee at the Community Hall on regularly scheduled <u>TUESDAY</u> evenings 7PM – 8PM.

The 2018 schedule, the regulations and requirements – are all posted on the community calendar at www. Itpoa.info.

In order to purchase stickers ALL applicants must present valid registration for all vehicles, boats, and trailers (yes, even renewals).

Proof of ownership is also required. No exceptions.

- Owners must provide deed, property tax bill or settlement papers.
- Tenants must provide a copy of a current lease.

A property owner sticker is valid for three calendar years and the cost is \$3.00 each. Renter and dependent stickers are valid for one calendar year and the cost is \$5.00 each.

Ramp keys are issued each calendar year and the cost is currently \$40.00.

Prior-year keys must be returned to avoid additional fees.


