Please help keep our community clean. Trash cans are provided through out the community and I urge you to make use of them. Dog Owners, please clean up after your pet! WELCOME NEW RESIDENTS

The LTPOA Board of Directors would like to welcome all new residents to the community. Please check the Ramps & Credentials report on page 4 to see how you obtain stickers for cars, boats, and trailers. The Association Bylaws and community rules and regulations are on the web site Itpoa.info.



In order to prevent disturbances to residents and damage to our property, all LTPOA property is closed from 11pm to 6am. Overnight parking for boaters is available by arrangement but overnight habitation on boats is strictly prohibited.

Crabbing, fishing, swimming, and mooring of boats is restricted to designated areas.

On all Maryland state waters, a personal watercraft may **not** be operated at **greater than 6 knots (6.9 mph)** within 100 feet of any shore, wharf, pier, bridge structure, abutment, or persons in the water. No one under the age of 16 may operate jet skis in Maryland waters...It's the Law!

Reminder: you must have a current sticker (year ending in **2025** or later) to park at London Towne parks, beaches, boat launches, docks and other community property. Guests must have a one day pass (contact your section president to receive a guest pass. http://ltpoa.info/sections.html).

Any vehicle without a sticker will be subject to towing at the owners expense.

What is the big deal about stickers? Why do I need one?

London Towne is a unique community with it's many beaches, water access, and playgrounds. Home owners of London Towne pay additional yearly taxes for the upkeep of the property and other amenities. Parking stickers are one way to control unauthorized use of LTPOA properties. Stickers are easy to obtain on line (see page 4 or **Itpoa.info**). Other arrangements may be possible if you are uncomfortable with computers or do not have access to one. The small fee for the stickers goes towards defraying the cost of the stickers and assists in the upkeep of the boat ramps.









RAMPS and CREDENTIALS

LTPOA IDENTIFICATION STICKERS

Please Note: Deadline for submitting ramp key and sticker requests prior to the July 4th Holiday is June 27.

Vehicle/vessel/trailer credential stickers and boat ramp keys are available through online communication (see below). They are **NOT** available during community meetings.

Credential stickers are needed to park on our LTPOA community property (ie beaches, parks, playgrounds, boat docks, etc.). Guest passes for vehicle parking are available from Section Presidents (listed on last page of this newsletter)

If you need a ramp key only, or ramp key and stickers, please send requests for online purchase to **candr.ltpoa@gmail.com**. In the email include a picture of your registration(s), your London Towne address and cell phone number. After your information is validated, you will receive an invoice via Square (online payment system). Once the invoice is paid by credit/debit card a representative will contact you for key/ sticker delivery.

If you need stickers only, please send requests for online purchase to **stickers.ltpoa@gmail.com**. In the email include picture of your registration(s) along with your London Towne address and cell phone number. After your information is validated, you will receive an invoice from a STICKER representative via Square (online payment system). Once the invoice is paid by credit/debit card, stickers will be delivered.

Sticker and Ramp Key Fees

Property Owner Stickers (Valid for 3 calendar years beginning in the year issued) are \$6.00.

Stickers for Renters and Dependents of Property Owners (Valid for the 1 calendar year in which it is issued) are \$10.00.

Ramp Keys are \$50.00. The key is valid for the calendar year in which it is issued. Turn in your old ramp keys to avoid additional fees.

What Documentation Is Required to Purchase Stickers?

- Property Owners Proof of Property Ownership (Deed, Tax Bill or Settlement papers)
- Tenants/Renters Proof of Residency A fully executed current lease with names of all parties, property address and the expiration date
- All current vehicle, vessel and/or trailer registrations. The documentation must be registered to your London Towne address if you are not a property owner

Welcome to London Towne and all our vast resources. London Towne Property Owners Association (LTPOA) has ownership and controls most of the shoreline along Shore Drive, the park lands and playgrounds, as well as our beaches. We also maintain the fishing and crabbing piers. All these amenities are for the use, entertainment and enjoyment of our residents. Please follow these simple rules to ensure the enjoyment and protection of these resources:

- ⇒ Community property is open from 6:00 a.m. to 11:00 pm;
- ⇒ No glass containers on any of our lands, broken glass is dangerous to people, pets, and wildlife;
- ⇒ Alcoholic beverages are permitted only with the special permission of the Board of Directors. Please attend your section meeting to obtain this permission;
- ⇒ Pets are never allowed on our beaches. No one wants our youngsters to be digging in the sand just to find a deposit left by a pet;
- ⇒ LTPOA has 21 pet stations throughout our community providing bags to clean up after pets. Please deposit these bags in the trash containers also placed around our community;
- ⇒ Towing is now in effect for any vehicle without a parking sticker. Sticker information may be found on page 4 or on line at **Itpoa.info**.
- ⇒ Please do not feed the ducks & geese as they become dependent on humanprovided good which is not good for them. Also, when they come onto our beaches, they leave a mess that is impossible to clean up. Several beaches have put up pinwheels to keep the ducks & geese off the beaches, so please do not disturb/ damage or take any of these pinwheels;
- ⇒ No off-road vehicles are permitted on our parklands, beaches, playgrounds etc. Remember, you must be 16 years old to legally operate LSVs on public roadways.



PLEASE SHARE THIS INFORMATION WITH YOUR COMMUNITY

- Your Community's assigned fog night is: **Sunday.**
 - Your community will only be fogged on Sunday nights during the 2025 season.
 - If we need to fog on a different night due to mosquito borne illness, a press release will be issued
 and residents with exemptions will be notified.
- ➤ Fogging can occur anytime between 7:00 PM and 2:30 AM
- > Fogging will not begin until 10 days after the community has been notified and we have received the Community Notification Verification Form
 - September 30 is the estimated last day of fogging for 2025
- Residents who do not wish their property to be fogged may file an exemption. The exemption policy and form can be found on our website: https://mda.maryland.gov/plants-pests/Documents/MosquitoControlExemptionForm.pdf
- > Please stay indoors while fogging operations are being conducted

Children's Bike Parade



This year the Children's Bike Parade will be held on **Saturday**, **June 21**.

Decorate your bike, trike, wagon, unicycle, or stroller and join us for a fun time. Ride alone or as a group. Participants will line up, beginning at 12:30pm, by the section 5 pump house. Those needing a shorter route may line up by the pumping station across from 531 Shore Dr. and ride to the section three picnic area (see map below). We'll have a short safety activity with our local police officers, and prizes will be awarded. We request that all riders follow state law and **wear a bike helmet.**











Rambling Raft Race:

The rambling raft race will take place on **Saturday**, **June 21nd** following the children's bike parade at the section three beach. Start working on your raft now so you have time to test it and perfect your design. This event is open to children and adults, single riders or teams. How about a little competition between sections? Non-powered vessel races are back this year. Kayaks, canoes, paddleboards, are all welcome. These races are separate from the Rambling Raft Races.

All participants must wear PFDs.

Decorate your kayak, canoe, paddle board or any other non-motorized water craft and join your neighbors for a parade on Glebe Bay. Got a costume to match your decorated watercraft? Feel free to wear it. The water parade will be held this year on **Saturday**, **July 12th** beginning at 11:00 am. Put in at the section one kayak launch and celebrate at the end with a picnic at the section one beach. (see map below) Hot dogs and hamburgers will be provided please bring your own beverages and a dish to share.

you there next year!!!










What's Happening at Beach 2?
